Does the act of disintegration become a statement - a refusal to accept the ordinary, a challenge to the status quo?

The way we process the familiar through subtraction, exclusion, or non-integration has the potential to reshape what we thought we knew.

How does our own life's experience guide the decision to integrate, exclude, or let go?

And how does letting go reveal the essence of what remains?

Inclusion tents to feel natural, while exclusion feels disruptive.

Do we seek completeness, or do we embrace the gaps that make room for imagination?

Can DIS!NTEGRATE also mean the deliberate choice to delete a shared, common imaginary, clearing the path for the unexpected?

We consciously disrupt collective expectations - not as an act of destruction, but as an opening for unimagined possibilities.

Can erasing the familiar create room for a vision unbound by precedent, free to redefine not just what we see, but how we see it?

Does DIS!NTEGRATE allow us to unlearn in order to imagine anew?

Do we sit on a chair that holds its shape, or do we remove a leg to explore balance?

Do we dismantle a structure to build anew, or to question what was never needed?

Do we choose simplicity by removing, or complexity by refusing to add?
